- On the sidelines of COP27, President Abdel Fattah El-Sisi met with US President Joe Biden in Sharm El-Sheikh, on November 11, 2022.
- President Biden congratulated President El-Sisi and Egypt for hosting the 27th United Nations Climate Change Conference and reaffirmed the United States' commitment to a successful Conference, strengthening coordination and consultation between the two sides on various political, security and regional issues, and continuing to promote and strengthen this partnership across various fields of cooperation within the framework of mutual respect and common interest.

 The agreement calls for development banks and international financial institutions to reform practices and priorities to ensure simplified access to climate finance.

Biden Announces Major Package to Support Egypt's Transition to Clean Energy

- President Biden announced a major aid package in collaboration with the E.U. and Germany, contributing more than \$250 million to help drive Egypt's transition to clean energy.
- The program will enable Egypt to deploy 10 gigawatts of new wind and solar energy while bringing five gigawatts of inefficient natural gas generation offline and would help Egypt capture the natural gas it currently flares, vents or leaks from oil and gas operations.

Egypt Signs Partnerships for Nexus of Water-Food-Energy (NWFE PROGRAM) at COP27

- Partnership agreements for Egypt's Platform for the NWFE Program and NWFE Plus, were signed in the field of transportation, as well as the finance agreements for the Egypt Partnership Agreements for Climate Transition (E-PACT).
- In support of the country's green transition, the NWFE Program and NWFE Plus leverage on Egypt's partnerships with multiple stakeholders, as the country has been leading efforts to mobilize finance and technical assistance.
- The NWFE program includes nine projects that represent a mitigation and adaptation priority projects encompassing water, food, and energy sectors.

Egypt-U.S. Announce Establishment of the Cairo Centre for Learning and Excellence on Adaptation and Resilience

- During a joint event sponsored by the Foreign Minister, President of COP27, Sameh Shoukry and the U.S. Special Presidential Envoy for Climate John Kerry, announced the establishment of the Cairo Centre for Learning and Excellence on Adaptation and Resilience in a special event on accelerating adaptation efforts in Africa under the joint Egyptian-U.S. sponsorship.
- U.S. Special Presidential Envoy for Climate, Kerry outlined the financial support
 package announced by President Biden during the conference, comprised \$150
 million to support efforts to adapt to climate change in Africa, including \$10
 million for the Cairo Centre, and \$25 million for the initiative of adaptation in
 Africa adopted by the African Union (AU), as well as financing a number of other
 programs to address climate change in Africa.

- "Solutions Day," concluded the thematic programming at COP27; a day when four initiatives were launched including Sustainable Urban Resilience for the Next Generation Initiative, Friends of Greening National Investment Plans in Africa and Developing Countries Initiative, Low Carbon Transport for Urban Sustainability Initiative and Global Waste Initiative 50 by 2050.

Negotiators were able to agree on a package of decisions that covered some of
the most difficult items of the agenda, including a loss and damage facility – with
a commitment to set up a financial support structure for the most vulnerable by
the next COP in 2023 – as well as the post-2025 finance goal, and the so-called
mitigation work program, that would reduce emissions faster, catalyze impactful
action, and secure assurances from key countries that they will take immediate
action to raise ambition and keep us on the path towards 1.5°C.
